In January, we celebrated the 10year anniversary for Pastor Sophea and Jenny Sem ministering with this church. Their leading and vision have opened doors for the community to know of God's love.

One of those ministries is the Office Skills Training School, teaching English, computer and office skills, free of charge. We have just begun the new term for the school and registration and attendance is more than 300. We hope to see these students continue to learn and develop marketable job skills to improve their futures.

A very significant praise is for the recently accepted proposal to an international organization. Ratanak, to help in funding the building project in Prey Romeas. This is Sophea's home village and it has been so exciting to see this project moving forward after many years of dreaming God's heart for this area. We will be constructing a school and community center, which will also serve as a church building. There are seven other nearby villages that we will now have the opportunity to reach out to.
